# Admission to Teacher Education

To become a Tennessee Teacher, students must be admitted to a Tennessee State Board of Education approved Educator Preparation Program and complete licensure requirements. Every undergraduate student in the College of Education begins as a pre-candidate. In order to become a teacher candidate, students must be admitted to the Teacher Education Program. Students who fail to apply or are not admitted to the program will not be permitted to enroll in Upper Division courses. Information below details both prerequisites and steps to apply.

# Admission to Teacher Education Timeline for

Guaranteed Enrollment in Next Semester Classes

Once you meet all criteria, you can submit your application for admission to the Teacher Education Program **at any point during the semester**. If you are pending completion of the criteria (e.g., enrolled in EESE), you *must* wait until the end of the semester to apply.

However, in order to guarantee your enrollment in courses that require admission to the **Teacher Education Program**, the completed Admission to Teacher Education application should be submitted by the Guaranteed Enrollment Deadline.

**START EARLY. This process takes some time.** Some parts of the admission to Teacher Education application may take you several weeks to complete. Please allow at least 4 weeks to successfully complete and submit your application.

**Submit everything by the deadline.** Incomplete applications will not be reviewed. Meeting the guaranteed enrollment deadline is highly recommended.

## To be admitted for SPRING SEMESTER:

Guarantee enrollment deadline of October 15.

### To be admitted for SUMMER TERMS:

Guaranteed enrollment deadline of March 15.

### To be admitted for FALL SEMESTER:

Guaranteed enrollment deadline of March 15.

Students may be admitted after the guaranteed enrollment deadline, but will not be guaranteed a space in their chosen classes.
