MT-Internal Grant Opportunities (MT-IGO)



Purpose

MT-IGO awards are intended to provide seed funding for tenured and tenure-track faculty in the preliminary stages of a larger research or creative activity agenda or program.



Tier I and II

"**Tier I**" is intended for research and creative activity projects *in* preparation to compete for successive external funding to support the continuation and amplification of scholarship.

"Tier II" is intended for research or creative activity that *currently* do not have the potential for external funding but advance scholarship in the faculty member's field or provide innovative opportunities for faculty and student engagement in scholarly activity.

- Project Description (5 page max)
 - Background/Significance/Methodology/Milestones/Delivera bles

Personnel and capacity

Budget/



Application and Review Process

Two cycles per year

- NSF-Style review
 - Raters and Readers (experts and non-experts)
 - Panel discussion and summary
 - Funding recommendation

Award and Revise/Resubmit Decisions

Undergraduate Research Experience and Creative Activity (URECA) Program



Program Overview

- University funds to directly support mentored undergraduate research w/annual budget of \$120,000
- Awards range from \$500 for beginners to \$3,500 for experienced student researchers
- Individual and team projects
- Grants offered fall, spring, summer
- Increasingly competitive

Proposal Development

- URECA Workshop
 - Virtual for Fall 2021
 - In-Person for Spring 2022
- Peer Mentor Scholar: Jared Frazier
- Specific elements of the proposal will depend on the discipline, but proposals might include the following:
 - Introduction
 - Background
 - Purpose
 - Methods
 - Timeline
 - Collaboration with Faculty Mentor(s)
- Sample proposals, budgets, and timelines



Review and Award Process

- Each proposal is scored by 5 committee members
- URECA Scoring Guide
- Proposals are sorted in rank order
- Cutoff determined by quality of proposals and amount of funding available
- Thoroughly review supplies budget and travel budget
- Award letters and revise/resubmit letters sent via email to students
