CHEM - 4560 - Nucleic Acids Chemistry
Effective Fall 2019

New Course

Nucleic Acids Chemistry. 3 credits. Prerequisites: Completion of CHEM 4500, CHEM 4510, or an equivalent biochemistry course. Nucleic Acids Chemistry will focus on the structure and chemistry of nucleic acids as well as the application of genetic techniques in biotechnology. The course will address the basic concepts of nucleic acids and the transfer of genetic information in a living system at the molecular level. The types of mutations, effects of mutagens, and mutation repair mechanisms will also be covered along with the application of techniques related to nucleic acids in biotechnology.

New Course

Food Biochemistry. 3 credits. Prerequisites: Completion of CHEM4500, CHEM4510, or an equivalent course in biochemistry. Food Biochemistry will cover the chemistry of major food groups as well as the nutritional values of natural and functional foods in disease prevention and management of metabolic disorders. Structural, biochemical, and metabolic aspects of amino acids, carbohydrates, and lipids will be discussed in the context of food-related metabolic disorders.
