### Biofuel Development from Biomass Modification and Characterization via Rama Spectroscopy Techniques

Jeff Mann, a summer URECA Gold grant recipient and a Chemistry major, focused his research on modified, plant-based biomass as a potential renewable energy source. He used microwave and sonication methods to produce biofuels and to analyze the chemical transformations that took place. He is a transfer student continuing his biomass valorization research here at MTSU. This research is vital to the study of renewable energy as a whole.

### An Evaluation of Perspective, Persona, and Point of View In Short Stories

Charlotte Daigle, a summer URECA Assistant grant recipient and an English major, focused her creative work studying perspective, persona, and point of view in fictional short stories. She studied the narrative voice of authors to build a framework for writing a future collection of short stories as an undergraduate Honors Thesis. She hopes to apply this research as a future writer and editor for the United Nations.


Students can then submit the program to you for extra credit.

**Current Research Focus:** The Relationship between Religion and Guilt after Sexual Encounters

Project Description: I studied how religion affects sex guilt via sexual attitudes, such as the importance of abstinence, communal attitudes about sex, and sociosexuality. I found that intended abstinence was the strongest mediator, those who intended to wait until marriage to have sex experienced the most guilt after having premarital sex.

### Why does this topic interest you?

This topic interests me because of the influence of religion. Coming from a religious background, I find it interesting to see how the scripts within Christianity affect the lives of individuals and the relationships they have.

What are your professional aspirations?



### LEVELS OF RECOGNITION

**Distinction in Undergraduate Research** 

• Students receive a dark blue, light blue, and white cord

### Scholar Distinction in Undergraduate Research

• Students receive a dark blue, light blue and white cord AND a medallion (see image in the upper right corner)

### **DISTINCTION CRITERIA**

**Distinction in Undergraduate Research** \*Students must fulfill all requirements

- Successful completion of an Assistant level URECA project 50 hours of research or more.
- Poster presentation or creative performance at one of the URC's signature events: Fall Open House, Scholars Week, or Summer Research Celebration.
- Active participation for at least one academic year in the Student Organization for the Advancement of Research (SOAR).
- 4 Endorsement by URECA faculty mentor.

Graduating in December?
Deadline to apply: 12/1/2021

Scholar Distinction in Undergraduate Research \*Students must fulfill all requirements

- Successful completion of a Scholar level URECA project 100 hours of research or more.
- Poster presentation or creative performance at one of the URC's signature events: Fall Open House, Scholars Week, or Summer Research Celebration.
- 3 Active participation for at least one academic year in the Student Organization for the Advancement of Research (SOAR).
- Poster or presentation at the National Conference on Undergraduate Research or published in a peer-reviewed academic journal.
- 5 Endorsement by URECA faculty mentor.
